One of central China's major cities, it is designated a sub-provincial city granted considerable autonomy for its economic significance.

It is formed by the three cities of Wuchang, Hanyang, and Hankou across the Yangtze River. Our main guest Professor Wang Bing is a political science scholar whose expertise is regulation reform, environmental policies, and policies against corruption.
